Where and When?

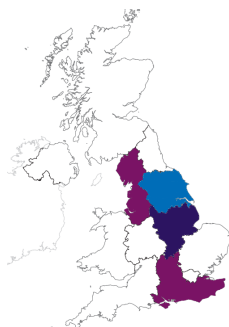
The first meetings are taking place on: **12th December: 4.30pm-5.30pm across the country.**
