I am delighted to share the news that our Early Years partnership has been designated by the Department for Education as an Early Years Stronger Practice Hub, the first in the Northwest!

It was very hard not being able to share the news for a while, but now I cannot stop talking to colleagues about the opportunities and the exciting plans in store!

Early Years Stronger Practice Hubs will provide advice, share good practice, and offer evidence-based Professional development for early years practitioners. The hubs are part of the early years education recovery support package which also include the early years experts and mentors programme.

We are absolutely thrilled to be collaborating with so many Early Years partners and, of course, local authority colleagues to ensure the best possible CPD and support is made available and, ultimately, so the best possible provision can be offered for young children. There will be 18 Hubs in total, the first 13 have been appointed, with us being the only one in the Northwest. The Hubs will be funded for two years.


The Early Years Stronger Practice Hubs programme is supported by both the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) and the National Children's Bureau (NCB).

Stronger Practice Hubs will support Early Years settings to improve outcomes for children in their local area across the EYFS, but specifically focussing on areas of development that research informs us have been most impacted by Covid-19; personal, social and emotional development (PSED); communication and language, and early literacy and maths.

Early Years Stronger Practice Hubs, will support to adopt evidence-based improvements by:

- establishing local networks of settings to share knowledge and effective practice
- proactively sharing information and advice on evidence-based approaches
- acting as a point of contact for bespoke advice, and signposting to other funded support
- working with the EEF to select evidence-based programmes to fund and make available to settings
