Adult Mental Health First Aid Two Day



Course Description

Stress, anxiety and depression are the biggest cause of sickness absence in our society and mental ill health is responsible for 91 million working days lost every year. Our course aims to promote positive wellbeing in the workplace - aiming to create a culture of support and open discussion around Mental Health allowing colleagues to feel more supported.

Our quality assured MHFA instructors deliver training that has been designed to fit into four manageable chunks:

- · Mental Health First Aid, mental health, and depression
- · Depression (cont.) and suicidal crisis
- · Anxiety, personality disorders, eating disorders and self harm
- Psychosis, schizophrenia and bipolar disorder

In each section you'll learn how to spot the early signs of a mental health issue, feel confident helping someone experiencing a mental health issue, provide help on a first aid basis, help prevent someone from hurting themselves or others, help stop a mental health issue from getting worse, help someone recover faster, guide someone towards the right support, reduce the stigma of mental health issues and improve staff well-being.

The sessions will be a mix of presentations, discussions and group work activities. Our instructors provide a safe learning environment and are trained to support you throughout the whole course. Everyone who attends the course will receive a copy of the MHFA manual and workbook, and a certificate to confirm that you are a trained Mental Health First Aider.

Adult Mental Health First Aid Refresher



Course Description

If you have trained as a Mental Health First Aider through a 2 day course, or are a MHFA Champion having completed a 1 day course, then you have skills for life that help with mental health and wellbeing for yourself and the people around you. At Bright Futures Training, we share the same view as that of MHFA England - mental health should be treated equally to physical health. Therefore, just like for physical first aid training, Mental Health First Aid training should be kept up to date. As such, completing refresher training every three years is recommended.

This refresher training is comprised of a mix of presentations, group discussions and workshop activities. Like all MHFA training courses, there is a limit on participant numbers to ensure that the instructor can fully engage with those in attendance, keeping them safe and supported while discussing some difficult subject matter.

The four hour MHFA Refresher course will support those in attendance to:

- Keep your awareness of mental health support current
- Update your knowledge of mental health and what influences it
- Practice applying the Mental Health First Aid action plan, and keep your knowledge of this fresh

Please note that this MHFA Refresher session is only for people who have completed an Adult MHFA Two Day or One Day course.



Youth Mental Health First Aid Two Day



Course Description

Record levels of young people are struggling. Academic pressure, social media, bullying, poverty, lack of availability of professional mental health support – all have been named as contributing to this epidemic of poor mental health in our young people. Key figures in a young person's life such as parents, family members, teachers, tutors, carers or youth workers can often spot when a young person is struggling but may not know how best to help.

Our Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) courses are for anyone who works with, lives with or supports young people aged 8-18. We train the adults in a young person's life to have the skills and confidence to step in, offer first aid and guide them towards the support they need. In doing so, they can speed up a young person's recovery, stop issues from developing into a crisis, and ultimately save lives.

The 2 days will be split into 4 sessions covering:

- · Youth Mental Health First Aid
- Depression and Anxiety
- Suicide and Psychosis
- · Self-harm and Eating Disorders

Everybody who completes the 2 day course will receive a copy of the MHFA manual and workbook, and a certificate to confirm that you are a trained Mental Health First Aider.

Youth Mental Health First Aid One Day



Course Description

Similar to our 2 day Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) course, the 1 day training is for anyone who works with, lives with or supports young people aged 8-18. We train the adults in a young person's life to have the skills and confidence to step in, offer first aid and guide them towards the support they need. In doing so, they can speed up a young person's recovery, stop issues from developing into a crisis, and ultimately save lives.

Our Youth MHFA One Day course qualifies you as a Youth Mental Health First Champion. Youth Mental Health First Champions have:

- An understanding of common mental health issues and how they can affect young people
- · Ability to spot signs of mental ill health in young people and guide them to a place of support
- Knowledge and confidence to advocate for mental health awareness
- Skills to support positive wellbeing

Learning takes place through a mix of presentations, group discussions and workshop activities. When you complete the course you will get a Youth MHFA manual and workbook to refer to whenever you need it and a certificate of attendance to say you are a Youth MHFA Champion.



Eating Disorders CPD



Course Description

This three hour session will offer a comprehensive introduction, covering topics such as:

- · what an eating disorder is
- · current state of play re eating disorders
- personal experience, with Hope sharing her story to bring them in to the mindset of someone who has had an eating disorder
- · how to have a conversation with someone
- · how to spot the signs
- practically what we can do to make sure the right messaging is out there, that the right people are getting support and how to prevent more people developing an eating disorder

This session will be led by Hope Virgo. For four years, Hope managed to keep it hidden, keeping dark secrets from friends and family. But then, on 17th November 2007, Hope's world changed forever. She was admitted to a mental health hospital. Her skin was yellowing, her heart was failing. She was barely recognizable. Forced to leave her family and friends, the hospital became her home. Over the next year, at her lowest ebb, Hope faced the biggest challenge of her life. She had to find the courage to beat her anorexia

Trauma Informed Support (With Attachment)



Course Description

Why do some children behave the way they do and how can we help them? This is fantastic Mental Health training for education staff working with Adopted, Looked After or Vulnerable Pupils. It would be beneficial to complete our Mental Health First Aid training first, but not essential.

The core aims of the programme are to:

- Explain how trauma and abuse impacts on a child's mental health
- Explore how events in childhood affect lifelong mental health
- Explain how children who have experienced trauma and abuse may behave in school
- · Explore ways schools can support the mental health of their students who have experience early trauma

The content of this course is a mixture of up to date theory and research on attachment and neuroscience, which will help participants understand the often contradictory and difficult behaviour of some pupils. It also provides an opportunity to learn and identify a range of practical and tried and tested strategies, which can be adapted to different educational settings to help children who have been adopted, looked after or who remain in difficult home environments. The course also provides an interactive opportunity for participants to bring their own individual case studies, to help identify bespoke strategies for their pupil/s.

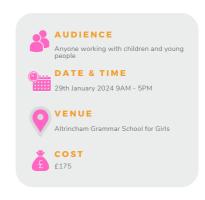

Domestic Abuse and the Impact on Children and Young People



Course Description

Coronavirus and the subsequent lockdowns have had a dramatic impact on all our lives. However, one area that has been impacted the most is domestic abuse. There were more than 40,000 calls and contacts made to the National Domestic Abuse Helpline during the first three months of lockdown, most by women seeking help. This represents an 80% increase on the same time last year, says the charity Refuge, which runs the helpline. As well as an increase in calls, Domestic Abuse organisations have also seen a 54% increase in women needing to flee their abusers.

This Domestic Abuse training course helps people who work with children to understand what domestic violence is, how it may begin, who perpetrates abuse, and how to identify when it may be happening. The course outlines the impact that domestic violence and abuse has on victims and children, and assists colleagues to understand how to respond appropriately to their concerns. Witnessing domestic violence – whether first hand, overhearing it, or only observing the after-effects – is considered a form of significant harm under safeguarding children guidance.

This is a two-part course. The first half of the day is designed so you can identify the signs that a child or young person is living in a home where there is domestic abuse. It will equip you to know how to respond and how to risk assess and refer victims to the appropriate services including those who are at high risk of homicide. The second half of the day is an exploration of how domestic abuse impacts on children and young people at different ages, how we can identify those children who are living with domestic abuse and how we can help them on the journey to recovery.



An Introduction to Supervision Skills



Course Description

There continues to be increasing demand on education staff to support children, young people, and their families on a regular basis. Many of these children have complex social and emotional issues. In addition, some services are experiencing cuts. Dealing with risk, trauma and uncertainty for school staff can have a negative impact on stress levels and if left unattended can lead to absence and burn-out. If you are interested in providing safe, supportive, and effective supervision for your team, this course is for you.

By the end of the one and a half days you will:

- Have a greater understanding of the purpose of supervision
- Have strengthened your communication skills for supervisory practice
- Have had a go at putting into practice a model of supervision
- Be more confident to offer a basic level of supervision to pastoral and support staff in your organisation

The one and a half day course uses a mixture of theory as well as practical, hands on and experiential learning. A must do for anyone who is interested in supporting staff to be the best they can for the children and young people they work with. This is a really useful course which compliments many of the other mental health courses we run.

NB This does not aim to replace specialist supervision which some staff may access, it is simply an introduction to supervision skills to help provide better daily support.

Course Description

This course is the PERFECT follow on from our MHFA and Trauma Informed Support courses.

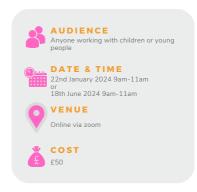
Emotion Coaching provides a value added dimension to behaviour management strategies and creates opportunities for long term solutions to children's wellbeing and resilience. It uses moments of heightened emotion and resulting behaviour to guide and teach the child or young person about more effective responses. It entails validating children's emotions, setting limits where appropriate and problem-solving with the child to develop more effective behavioural strategies. Through empathetic engagement, the child's emotional state is verbally acknowledged and validated, promoting a sense of security and feeling 'felt'. This activates changes in the child's neurological system and allows the child to calm down, physiologically and psychologically.

Emotion Coached children and young people:

- Achieve more academically in school
- Are more popular
- Have fewer behavioural problems
- Have fewer infectious illnesses
- · Are more emotionally stable
- · Are more resilient



Helping Children and Young People Manage Anxiety



Course Description

Anxiety is the most common mental health issue with children and young people. This has been exacerbated with the current pandemic, with many more children feeling anxiety and those who already experienced it, finding their symptoms increasing. Our children's return to school is very likely going to present many of these issues in the classroom.

Help prepare yourselves to help your students. This is a very practical, hands on course that you will immediately be able to put into practice. It is filled with activities and techniques that you can use with both individuals and groups of students.

By the end of the course you will be able to:

- Have an understanding of the physiological effects of anxiety on our physical health, our emotions and importantly for our children and young people, how it impacts on their behaviour
- Use grounding techniques to ease anxiety overwhelm
- Effectively Talk to students about emotions and feelings
- Discuss specific anxiety around Covid-19
- Use creative and imaginative ways of helping our students understand their anxiety and how to help themselves

Childhood Bereavement



Course Description

On average, 1 in every 29 children will be bereaved of a parent. That's one in every class. This is before the Covid-19 Pandemic. Now we have a situation with many children having lost someone they love recently, including lots of grandparents. Children and young people need support from the school community to ensure that they can cope with their grief. That's why it's vital that teachers and staff understand how to support the grieving children and young people in their school.

Our online bereavement training course will help you understand:

- What is childhood bereavement?
- How grief affects a child or young person
- · The stages of grief
- · How you can help them cope with bereavement in schools

Aimed at both primary and secondary school teachers, the course will cover:

- The importance of communication
- Planning and preparation
- When to seek further support
- · Help, support and self-care
- · Useful strategies to help



Customer Service and De-escalation



Course Description

We are pleased to be working with 2 experienced facilitators from Marketing and Mental Health backgrounds to deliver valuable training around De-escalation techniques and customer service.

All school staff, but significantly receptionists and front line pastoral staff, have to have so many conversations with parents. Sometimes these conversations can be sensitive or difficult to manage, and not all front line staff have had high quality training on how to get the best out of every conversation.

Every interaction the school has with parents is an opportunity to deepen relationships and really engage. This session will maintain a valuable focus on staff wellbeing while working in a busy school environment, and will use aspects of Emotion Coaching and some Transactional Analysis to help staff manage conflict and difficult conversations.

Menopause Training (Making Every Contact Count)



Course Description

Traditionally, menopause is viewed as a specialist medical and clinical condition and as such, most people at the frontline of running support services or initiatives within the health system, the community and workplaces, do not routinely ask about menopause. It is not surprising that women are reluctant or feel unable to talk about menopause and its impact on their lives.

Through the Making Every Contact Count (MECC) approach, participants will be able to challenge this culture and openly have menopause related conversations with friends, family, a colleague or with an individual accessing a service. Using the 3A's (ASK, ASSIST, ACT) framework, participants will be able to explore the physical, emotional and social impacts of menopause, and provide information about how to access information and local support through menopause cafes, GPs, lifestyle services, online resources and apps.

During this 3 hour session, participants will be able to:

- 1. Review their knowledge of menopause
- 2. Reflect on the relevance of menopause as part of their organisation's work
- 3. Discuss recognition of menopause and associated risks of missed diagnosis
- 4. Make action plans on what they can do to progress practice within their service/organisation

At the end of the programme, all participants will receive a certificate of attendance with 2 CPD points.



Headteacher and SLT Mental Health; Discussing the Real Issues that Affect many Senior Leaders



Course Description

Darren Morgan, Headteacher at Kings Road Primary, will be delivering a series of three free Headteacher and SLT Mental Heath sessions. We would encourage you to attend all three sessions but they can also be booked individually.

Session overviews

Session One: Exploring the Issues

This is a repeated session from May 2023. Pressures for many headteachers and senior leaders are at the point of crises with severe consequences in terms of mental health and well-being. In a bid to aid senior leaders, Darren explores the pressures of Ofsted, attempting to understand the vast range and depth of responsibility involved in the process. However, he will quickly move on to the pressures that, at times seem insurmountable but are difficult to talk about, such as, parents, pupils' behaviour, loneliness and neighbours!

Session Two: Working Together to Support Each Other Part 1

and

Session Three: Working Together to Support Each Other Part 2

Building on from session 1, in these two sessions Darren will attempt to further identity issues that are affecting so many, facilitate discussion and develop a support network.

Course Description

- · Reflect on factors that influence parenting and the parent-child relationship.
- · Understand attachment and the impact of adverse childhood experiences.
- · Acting with professional curiosity and holding difficult conversations.
- · Using motivational interviewing techniques to support and motivate lasting change within families.
- · Understanding risk, assessing need, and supporting families to access early help and specialist services.
- · Developing practice to meaningfully capture the voice of the child.
- · Responding to disclosures in line with achieving best evidence principles and child centred approaches.
- · Practical tools and resources to facilitate direct work with children and parents.
- · Developing inclusive practice to overcome barriers to supporting families.
- · Effective record keeping skills.
- · Developing safe and effective practice when home visiting and lone working.

This half day course will support senior leaders to create a safe culture within their organisation supported by policies that are clear, interlinked and support both the child who has harmed, and the child who has been harmed. The course will allow professionals to consider their school environment and areas of priority by hotspot mapping and thinking honestly about the prevalence of sexual harassment and violence in school.

Course content will include:

- · Statutory requirements and key messages from guidance.
- · Ideas on how to incorporate a 'zero-tolerance' approach where the assumed response is not to permanently exclude.
- · Recognising the responsibility to support not only child who has been harmed but also the child who has harmed.
- Exploring how we record and analyse incidents of sexual harassment and violence.
- · Top tips on how to ensure that your behavioural policy, safeguarding policy and anti-bullying policy reinforce your culture and approach to managing sexual harassment and sexual violence.

The TSC Pupil Premium Reviewer Guide has been updated and written in partnership with DfE, EEF and the West Midlands Pupil Premium Reviewer Training Centre, based at The Golden Thread Teaching School Hub lead school, Painsley Catholic College in Cheadle, Staffordshire. - · Be able to complete PP reviews as an accredited reviewer.

Handling History



Course Description

Do you want a wealth of suggestions on how to meet the high level outcomes for children in each of the phases for History? These will be based on the very latest research, pedagogy and guidance from the Historical Association and Ofsted. These online courses are designed for class teachers (rather than subject leaders), to develop their own subject knowledge and therefore ensure secure pupil knowledge and understanding of historical substantive and disciplinary concepts. We will introduce the disciplinary knowledge of History (how historians study the past and construct accounts).

We will start by establishing your bespoke requests for which History units you cover in the appropriate phase in your school. Each session will carefully consider: the expectations for the knowledge and conceptual understanding based on the current guidance and N.C., how to build upon prior knowledge, methods to develop pupils' "mental timeline" of the past and their coherent chronological understanding over and within long and short timescales, engaging activities, local and regional historical perspectives of national and global historical contexts, the enquiry approach and how it can be used to develop and maintain interest and curiosity, creative ways for children to show what they know at the end of an enquiry in addition to extended writing, ways to assess knowledge and understanding, meaningful cross curricular links with other subjects with the History units for the phase and recommendations of appropriate resources for the stage and age of the children to support the development of the child's understanding of History and your own subject knowledge as a class teacher.

Getting a Grip on Geography



Course Description

Geography is an engaging subject for children, but often as class teachers we, don't know where to start with designing meaningful activities to develop secure locational and place knowledge, map skills and fieldwork to develop a secure knowledge and understanding of places and processes. These sessions will be based on the very latest research, pedagogy and guidance from the subject associations and Ofsted. These courses are designed for class teachers to develop their own subject knowledge and ensure secure pupil knowledge and deeper understanding of geographical concepts.

We will start by establishing your bespoke requests for the geographical units you cover in this phase in your school. Each session will carefully consider the following: the scope and ambition of the National Curriculum guidance for Geography, the locational and place knowledge and vocabulary essential for pupils to learn and remember, engaging activities to develop accurate map making and ways to maximise the development of vital fieldwork skills anywhere, ways to teach the use and interpretation of a variety of geographical sources, local and regional perspectives for national and global geographical contexts, the enquiry approach, creative ways to show what they know at the end of an enquiry including extended writing, ways to assess to ensure all pupils make progress, meaningful cross curricular links of Geography with other subjects in the phase N.C. and recommeded resources for the stage and age of the children to support the development of the child's knowledge and understanding of Geography and your own subject knowledge as a class teacher.

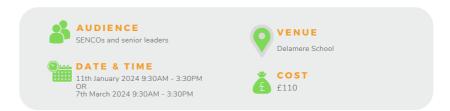

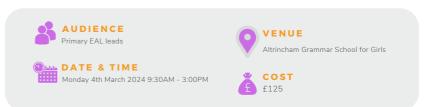
